information below should help explain things better.

OBJECTIVE of the Coordinating Church Council: In order to better equip First Baptist Church

Fort Thomas to seek out God's plan as a church, we have sought out an organizational

structure that will allow the church to cover all aspects of ministry. The church is transitioning to a Coordinating Council model of organization. This council is

charged with helping create a cohesive church calendar, coordinate with the treasurer to

form a church budget, and serve as liaisons to ministry leaders under their designated focus.

EXPLANATION: The council is composed of:

Worship Coordinator - Miriam Fuller

Deacon Chairperson - Walter Mershon

The following three (3) positions are what is being voted on this Sunday, August 7 th . The

church voted on the first three (3) positions back in 2020. At a recent council meeting we

filled the other three (3) spots to complete the council.

Missions Coordinator - Jackie Harry

Discipleship Coordinator - Lori Maines

Building/Grounds Chairperson - Dale Ayers

The church Administrative Assistant serves as a non-voting member. It will help to make sure

that the activities of the church align with our core vision. As elected positions of the church,

the council is able to make recommendations for the church, doing so with the trust of those

in the church body. Coordinators are not authoritative over their area, but an ambassador and helper. continued on next page...

BENEFITS:

- Clear organizational direction, which creates better coordination of church ministry efforts.
- Creates better gateway for new people to get involved. By focusing on a ministry mindset instead of a committee, leaders are given more opportunities to recruit help.
- Can be adapted to face new challenges. Will rely upon ad hoc committees that are equipped to face challenges.
- Can encourage folks to continue serving where things are excelling.

CHALLENGES:

- Will be a learning curve. Patience with each other. :)
- Trust of committee and of church. Business meetings will still be needed, but congregation will trust council to handle many decisions. This is not very different from current structure, just something to consider.
