Greetings church family!

THE NUMBER 1 CHRISTMAS SONG OF ALL TIME...ACCORDING TO TIME MAGAZINE

The names Joseph Mohr and Franz
Xaver Gruber have largely
vanished into the annals of
Christmas tormentors, but their
greatest triumph lives on. "Silent
Night," which Mohr wrote the
lyrics for (in German) in 1816 and
Gruber put to music two years later,
is the most recorded Christmas song
in the modern era.

To determine this fact, TIME crawled the records at the U.S. Copyright Office, which offers digitized registrations going back to 1978, and collected data on every Christmas album recorded since that time. "Silent Night," it turns out, is not merely the most popular carol; with 733 copyrighted recordings since 1978, it is nearly twice as dominant as "Joy to the World," a distant second with 391 records to its name.

Our Women's Mary Francis Gould Mission Group, will be asking for donations for the 24-7 Mission in Grenada. What do they do and who are they? Let's meet them.



Rev. Justin and Erica Zauflik started Grenada 24-7 in 2012. They are the resident directors overseeing all the missions that take place on the island. Before God called them to Grenada they had been in collegiate ministry for over a decade. What started out as a small Bible study grew into an international ministry reaching nations in Asia, Africa, Europe and the Caribbean.

Now, let's meet some of their newest Team Members!



Rev. Jason & Kari Grigler oversee the youth ministry. Before joining the team, they planted a church in Louisville Kentucky where Jason served as pastor and Kari a deacon. Their heart and calling has led them to serve in East Africa, the Caribbean and Latin America. For over 10 years, Jason worked with refugees from all over the globe and was the director of a residential recovery program for homeless men. FUN FACT: Jason actually lived in Grenada as an intern (with another ministry) when he was 17.

- Ranked #1 for the most alcohol consumption in the Caribbean
- Ranked #1 for most cases of extreme poverty in the Eastern Caribbean
- Ranked #4 for the most alcohol consumption in the whole world
- Ranked #10 for the most cases of rape crime in the world
- Ranked #57 for the percentage of those in poverty on our side of the island
- 66% of the poor population are youth
- 77% of heads of households have only a primary education
- 85% of post secondary educated live off the island

As you can see, the need is great on this small island. They are yearning for a way to make a living and to get out of poverty. They need help with education and they are also seeking God. They need someone to lead them to Jesus.

This is why our Mission group wants our winter mission giving to go to Grenada 24-7




