I always look forward to Extreme Build and am excited that on Saturday, we will dedicate the 16th house built here. We make a substantial donation toward the cost of the house and provide much of the labor for its construction as volunteers.

This year's house will be become home to a single mother and her two children. Without our help, she would not qualify. With our help, she will now have a mortgage payment less than her rent had been and will gain equity.

The street we are building on is one with which we are familiar. Down the street is a house I helped with while still the pastor at Faith. Taj is now a fifth grader who lives in that house who comes down to check on us everyday after school on his bike. His mischievous smile and excitement are reminders that his childhood has changed in immeasurable ways because of Extreme Build. Caddy corner to our lot is one of the earliest houses that we built still occupied by the family for whom we built it.

If you haven't already, I would encourage you and your church to make a donation to Extreme Build that has changed so many lives. We have been joined in our efforts this year by Scarlette Jasper a CBF Global Field Personnel and Keith Stillwell with together for hope.

This program is only possible because of our partnership with Kentucky Highland Housing and many of the local churches and ministries here. We have established important lasting relationships here over the years.

As I watched the house rise and take shape, I am reminded that what seems impossible is possible as we follow Christ together.




Children's Ministry: Here's Why What You Do Matters We never know what we say or do with a child that will change their lives forever. This is why it is so important to work with children.
