## The Vision

Church Family,

Almost three months ago I remember agonizing over the decision of whether or not we should cancel the next Sunday morning service because word was getting out about something called the coronavirus that was set to take over the country. Looking back it should not have been a hard decision as we have undoubtedly seen the issues caused by this dreadful virus and the toll it has taken on the entire country. We have lived through the last few months with uncertainty and have had to find new ways to worship and connect with each other.

While the decision to stop in person gatherings was difficult, we now find ourselves with questions that are unexpectedly difficult as well: When do we resume in person worship? What will it look like? How can we gather in a way that continues to keep people as safe as possible, using information that seems to change by the minute?

During times like this, we trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us to discern what is the best decision for our own congregation. Over the last few weeks I have been in discussion with the current group of our coordinating council to develop a timeline for gathering. We met in early May and decided that the best thing to do was meet again after Memorial Day to reevaluate where things stand. After meeting on Wednesday, May 27 we have made the decision to continue online only worship for the next few weeks, with a plan to reevaluate on Wednesday June 17.

Reasons for this are ones that you might imagine. We have a congregation filled with many at risk members, due to age and other health conditions. Gathering together would require us to still maintain social distance. Congregational singing would not be doable due to the increased risk of an airborne virus. With the recent decision to reopen large portions of the state, we believe that a cautious approach is the best course of action at this point. Gathering together is important, but we believe unnecessary risk should be avoided. I know that many churches are already worshiping and I trust that they are doing what they feel as best. We just do not feel that is the right decision for us.

I know that this news is disappointing for many. It is disappointing for me as I miss being with you all. I owe you a great deal of gratitude because part of the reason this cautious approach can be taken is because of your faithfulness and kind spirits through adversity. Our online worship has been well received. You have been incredibly generous in supporting our missions giving via the COVID 19 Benevolence fund and supporting Scarlette Jasper and her work in McCreary County. At the time of writing this, giving to Scarlette has reached \$1300. Our other benevolence fund has several hundred dollars as well. We have handed at least 150 green light bulbs to our community as a sign of support those battling COVID19. Just this week we were able to send much needed cleaning supplies to international students that are living on the campus of NKU because they are unable to return home.

While we are not in the building, we have also taken great efforts to improve the spaces where we gather. Our main floor bathrooms are in the process of renovations and I cannot wait for you all to see the finished product. We have several projects in place, some of which I will not disclose just yet as I want you to be surprised with the progress being made. This new schedule has given us time to improve the spaces where we will gather again someday.

You are a church that loves Jesus and loves each other well. I have heard of so many cards and letters and phone calls that you all have sent to reach out to each other. You have been on the phone, running errands for our most vulnerable, and have done so with a great deal of compassion. While the church is not gathering on Sunday mornings in person, we are still continuing to "Shine God's Light and Share God's Love" in so many ways.

This journey has been frustrating, but I believe God will use it to show us incredible things. Please continue to pray for each other and support each other in the ways that you know how. At some point in the future we will all be gathered in the sanctuary as the people of God and we will tell stories of God's faithfulness through this crisis. Better days are coming, I can feel it!

If there is anything that we can do for you in the days to come, please do not hesitate to reach out to us. If you have prayer requests, please let us know so that we can share them with each other. If you have praises, we would love to hear those as well! As you pray, be sure to ask God for discernment in figuring out how we can expand as the people of God and just maybe you can ask that question I like to throw out from time to time...."What's next?"




