FROM OUR PASTOR

Greetings church family!

I have never really considered myself to be a creature of habit. As someone who knows that about myself, I admittedly use that to mess with folks who are more likely to fall into routines. When Jenni and I lived in Cynthiana, we would spend many date nights driving to Lexington. To get to Lexington there are about 4-5 different roads that all take about the same amount of time. Just to keep Jenni on her toes, I'd take as many different routes as possible, just to see what happened. It drove her crazy!

As I get older, I do find that while I do not have precise routines, I am more and more a creature of habit. I think that is because we get older, we gain better understanding of what we like and what we do not like. And so it just so happens that looking back over the past few weeks, months, or years, it turns out that many of our rhythms are unintentional. They are just what we like to do and we think nothing of it. If we are not careful, those routines can become ruts.

A few weeks ago you all gave me the opportunity to attend the Fresh Expressions Conference in Richmond, VA. The conference was eye opening and one of the best events I have ever attended. The idea of what the church can look like and how we adapt can be intimidating and exciting all at once!

Just as we get into personal routines, churches can fall into routines and ruts. We do the same things for so long that we forget the joy in trying something new. Pastor Leonard Sweet presented at the conference and reminded me of the importance of randomization. Sometimes our best chances of being shaped come from trying new things. An example for Sweet meant grabbing random magazines and reading whatever he finds. The spiritual insights are incredible and come from unexpected places. A person with no background in knitting or hunting or fashion might learn something about the world that helps us understand God better.

It is good to have some routine, but never to the point where we forget we serve a God who promised to do a new thing! If you are feeling like you might be in a rut, what can you do try something new? Take up a hobby or watch a show you'd typically never pick. Take a left where you would typically would have taken a right. See how God takes our randomization to do something incredible!

Shine on. Press on. Go on

FROM OUR CHILDREN'S MINISTER


