FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

If you have ever had a chance to see my Facebook page, you will not be surprised to know that I take lots of pictures of my children. One of my favorite comedians, Jim Gaffigan, once said that he believes he has taken more pictures of his kids than his dad ever looked at him. With cell phones constantly at hand, I take pictures of all kinds of things throughout the day, especially my kids.

At night (typically after a quick celebration of putting them to bed), Jenni and I inevitably look at those pictures. We'll share moments from the day and feel a renewed fondness of our kids. With them not directly in front of us, we see things differently. We see the changes that are sometimes harder to notice in the moment.

What seems to happen with these photos is that I'll look back at one year ago or two years ago and have a hard time believing how small I now realize they were. At the time I thought they were so big! Looking back I believe that I treated them with different expectations, forgetting that little bodies and little minds can only have so much control. When I think of how much they have since grown, I am proud.

In the same ways we look at the development of our children, we'll look back at the last few years of our church. We can see the moments that brought us joy, the moments that made us worried, and think of all of the ways that we have been changed by being in fellowship with each other.

Until then, let's use this time to prepare ourselves for those next steps. Commit to prayer. Think back on what is really important and consider what maybe doesn't matter as much as we once thought. Thankful Doughnuts


This is a decoration that reminds kids to be thankful for everything they have instead of worrying about the "empty spaces" in their lives.


