FBC Fort Thomas is a giving church. This is a fact supported by years of ministry and missions support beyond what anyone believes a church our size can produce! We support so many worthwhile endeavors and I am so thankful for your generosity. Now, I would like to challenge your generosity. Our budget income over the past few months has been low. We are not meeting our monthly budget needs. This will become a problem for us over the winter months. The gas and electric charges for the winter are expected to increase dramatically. In addition to the gas and electric charges, any charges for snow removal will be outside of our already stretched budget.

But wait, I can hear you say, we are not paying a full-time pastor right now, so doesn't that give us some extra money? Not really. There are things we need to pay for while we are looking for a new pastor. We still have the expenses of a supply pastor, and they may be less than a full-time pastor, but they are not free. We also need to be sure to have enough money to cover our staff expenses, because our staff members are picking up more of the workload now that we are without a pastor. In addition, many routine maintenance projects were postponed due to the pandemic. We are currently working to have the church professionally cleaned, because this has not been done for several years. It is a lot!

That is why I am asking our church of cheerful givers to consider a slight increase in your routine giving. I know that you are already giving, but could you increase your giving even slightly? A 1% increase might not be too much for you, but it might make a significant difference to our budget..

Please pray about this request for a slight giving increase. I would not ask if it was not important. I realize that we have not had a business meeting in some time, so next month I will be including the current budget, income, and spending for your review. You can see exactly how and where the money you give has been spent. I want everyone to feel comfortable that your church is being cared for and is financially responsible.

HURRICANE IAN: taken from an article written by Bob Fox

Whenever there is a hurricane in Florida, I think back some twenty-five years ago when a prominent religious figure searching for meaning in a storm that took multiple lives said that the weather event was God's judgment on the United States for its immorality. In addition to being a cruel and callous comment, it is one that is demonstrably false from the words of Jesus about the tower that falls. I was embarrassed to have our faith represented to the world in this way.

Now, as I think about this sort of event, I think a better word for what happens is not judgment but consequence. The weather that has become more violent and unpredictable are not God's judgment. Didn't God promise Noah not to destroy the world again with water? Rather, the chaos of our planet that seems to be ever increasing is likely a consequence of our poor stewardship of God's creation.

From the garden, scripture says that God has given us freedom to make choices in the way we treat nature. As stewards, we are responsible for those choices. As we have polluted the environment, strip mined mountains, released noxious gasses into the atmosphere and used up water we are now facing the consequences of those choices.

The church ought to be talking about all of these disasters not as God's judgment on humanity but rather as the consequences of people failing to care for what God has given us in creation. Shouldn't those who believe that God's creation is good be fighting to protect and preserve it? Perhaps we need to think about creation care as gospel work.

Meanwhile, let's pray for those left in the path of Hurricane Ian.
